The SPS Office of Student Support is pleased to announce its Summer 2022 Academic and Professional Development Grant Recipients.

Previously recognized as the Global Impact Award, the grant is intended to support students in pursuing tailored, hands-on learning experiences aligned with their academic programs that include, but are not limited to: graduate research, capstone projects, and experiential learning/professional development opportunities.



Natalia Alexander Negotiation and Conflict Resolution

Natalia plans to use the funding in order to attend the Global Behavioral Science program (GLOBES), a joint research practicum hosted by the University of Cambridge along with professors from Columbia. This program provides an intellectual deep dive into the basics of behavioral science and its real world applications, along with hands-on experience in carrying out behavioral science research, from study development to dissemination. In addition to the rare opportunity to become a published researcher via the program, learning how to design, test, implement, monitor and evaluate human behavioral studies as it relates to elements of conflict will bring Natalia a scientific layer of understanding and legitimacy to theoretical approaches to conflict resolution.



Kathryn Olivia Beros Sustainability Management

Kathryn has been awarded funding to attend Agrivoltaics2022, the third global conference of scientific exchange and networking for photovoltaic and agriculture researchers, companies, farming associations, and political and finance experts. By becoming an expert in the science behind agrivoltaics, she plans to position herself to fill the gap between farming and solar as an agrivoltaic developer and sustainable agriculture consultant providing feasibility studies to farmers interested in pursuing agrivoltaics. The conference, held in Piacenza, Italy, ensures that she is up-to-date on the current science and results of global agrivoltaic trials as well as make connections with potential partners and clients.

Sadie has been awarded funding to complete her capstone project on poetry centered around health and healing. Her plan is to create an anthology of poems by contemporary healers, including a few of her original pieces; pulling from physicians, poets, patients, family members, and witnesses, she hopes to create a holistic picture of giving and receiving care.



Jie Guo *Enterprise Risk Management*

Jie plans to use the funding and skills learned in the Enterprise Risk Management to offset costs related to her Compliance and Operational Risk internship with Angelo's Pizza. As part of her role, she will monitor performance and help in the development of risk metrics, as well as diagnose compliance and regulatory concerns to ensure that the organization complies with relevant laws. Jie hopes to gain experience and apply her knowledge to practical situations.



Chelsea Hicks *Narrative Medicine*

Chelsea is interested in the intersections of art and medicine, and has been awarded funding to complete her capstone project on the impact of visual art in healthcare and medical education. Her goal is to highlight the patient experiences that are often left unarticulated through the creation of drawings and paintings combined with patient interviews pertaining to illness. As she looks into studying osteopathic medicine in the future, Chelsea hopes to see how the inclusion of art in the healing environment will promote the healing process and enhance the quality of patients' lives.



Lindsay MorrisNegotiation and Conflict Resolution

To supplement her internship with The Center for Mediation and Training, Lindsay has been awarded funding to participate in a divorce mediation training program which covers financial, legal, and emotional issues common to divorce and family mediation. Working in an office setting alongside lawyers, therapists, coaches, and mediators will give her different perspectives on the process of family and marital mediation, as well as the unique opportunity to mediate actual cases with close supervision from seasoned professionals. After this training course is completed, she will receive a certification in divorce mediation and cultivate the skills instrumental to her goals of building her own family therapy and mediation practice.



Momoka Shiozumi Sustainability Management

Momoka Shiozumi has been awarded funding in order to attend the US SIF Forum for Sustainable and Responsible Investment earlier this June. The US SIF Member Day and Annual Conference offers a unique opportunity to network with leaders of the sustainable and impact investing community and to learn about new approaches, trends, and policy developments in the field. After witnessing the catastrophic situation in Fukushima during her undergraduate studies, she became interested in the intersection of sustainability and finance. She plans to use this opportunity to network with leaders in the field, as well as take what she learns and apply it in her studies and as a member of the Sustainable Investing Club.
